Pitmedden Kirk 15th March 2024 Newsletter



Our apple trees have produced a lot of fruit this year. In part, this will be down to the right weather conditions at the right time, something I have no control over. And maybe they've also reached 'the right age' and are suitably mature. But there is another important factor. For the last couple of years they have been tended by someone who knows fruit trees and how to nurture them.

He has dug out the grass at the base, giving their roots a chance to breathe and allowing them a feeding area where they don't have to compete for water and

nutrients with the tough and greedy grass. He also started a pruning regime. Gently at first, but more severe in the second and third year. The benefits were not instant, it has taken time, but they are all the better for expert care. While I was happy to have someone else look after them, I did sometimes worry when I saw all the healthy looking prunings on the ground.

The Bible has a lot to say about gardening, nurture, and pruning. It's a well-used metaphor, and sometimes the story puts us in the role of gardener. We do have a degree of responsibility for our own lives: where we are, what we do, the things we allow to influence us and how that affects the people we are.

However, as Christians, we also recognise that the biggest influence in our lives is God. God is the gardener. We have 'surrendered' our lives and our future – not in a way that absolves us from any responsibility, but in a way that recognises that God is the expert, and wants to play an active part in our lives. God's purpose is to nurture us, care for us, and enable us to produce good fruit that will feed others. That will involve pruning as well as providing nutrition and the right growing conditions. Are we prepared for that? Are we willing to say, 'take my life'? Do we really want God to not only show us what needs to be pruned, but let God get on with it? Do we really believe that in the end, we will be stronger, healthier and more productive? It can be scary, it can feel like a loss of control, but it can also be exciting – what is faith, if it's not hope in an 'unknown' future with God?
