Blessed are those who trust in the Lord, whose trust is in the Lord. They shall be like a tree planted by the water, sending out its roots by the stream. It shall not fear when the heat comes, and its leaves shall stay green; in the year of drought it is not anxious, and it does not cease to bear fruit. Jeremiah 17:7-8 NRSVA

Today I spotted celandine growing in two different situations. The photographs don't show it very well – I should have taken a ruler on my walk! – but those growing in the shadows of the wood have leaves about 2cm across with flowers the size of a penny, but mostly closed. The ones growing on the banks of the stream have far fewer leaves, but they are 4cm in diameter, the flowers are more numerous and not only much bigger, but fully open to the sun.

I was reminded of this verse from Jeremiah, and similar sentiments in Psalm 1 (...trees planted by streams of water...yield their fruit in season...in all that they do, they prosper) and Ezekial 47 (...on the banks, on both sides of the river...they will bear fresh fruit every month because the water for them flows from the sanctuary. Their fruit will be for food, and their leaves for healing.)

What can we learn from these humble flowers? Our roots should not just go down deep, but we need to be planted where we can feed on, and be refreshed by, the source of life itself, God and God's Spirit. To be fruitful, to feed and help others, and be a healing presence where God has placed us, we need

to access God's sustaining, supporting, powerful and nourishing presence, 24/7. A 'shower of rain' on Sunday, or a 'dip in the pool' at a mid-week study group is great, and keeps us going. But to flourish, bear fruit, be transformed into the people God has created us to be and spread the Gospel, we will need to make dwelling by the river of life and accessing all that God offers us, our way of life. At a time of change for us all, finding our feet and our place, not only in a new united parish, but a parish in vacancy, we can all draw upon the water of life that God freely offers, at all times and in all situations, and offer ourselves and the gifts God gives us to each other and our communities.

You might like to try '*Pause'*, an App designed to help you do just that and take a minute or two each day to rest in **II** God's presence.
