As I have followed the proceedings, and read the reports, one thing in particular has struck me. We are a mixed-economy church. The diversity that has been the topic of recent newsletters is nowhere more apparent than in the Assembly Hall, in the information given, in the questions asked, and the debates that have ensued. There are people — and by extension, congregations — who come to Assembly ready to listen, to engage, to question, and ultimately to recognise the

decisions taken by Assembly, enthusiastically taking them back to their own situations to work out how best to take things forward. Of course, there are those disagree, who vote against motions, but then accept the corporate decision, presenting them to their congregations and acting in a way that honours the Presbyterian system of governance, which is to accept the will of Assembly. It must be said that there are also congregations who refuse to engage, who it appears do not comply with church law, do not join the debate, and indeed who never send requested information or commissioners to Assembly, thus denying the church the opportunity to hear their point of view and work through differences. And what applies to congregations also applies to individuals.

"Building ...Together" is not just an aspiration, pie-in-the-sky, but something we need to engage in. As individuals and communities of faith, we need to build each other up, deepen our relationship with Jesus and each other, and show that we love and trust each other. This is the path that Formartine is on. Hallelujah!

What does this picture say to you? I see new growth, bright and fresh and tender. On that same branch, I see older, tough greenery, in some places supporting that new growth. I also see some hard stems, woody and desiccated, with lichen growth. The internet tells me, "Lichen does not kill a tree... but does grow on slow-growing and sometimes declining trees..."


