Progress of the project

Our application to The Scottish Land Fund (SLF) for the major funding to purchase the building and urgent repairs is now in. We expect to find out whether we have been successful in our SLF bid in June. If we are, it will be 'full steam ahead' to secure funding to improve the building. Meantime, Awards for All funding is allowing us to continue expanding our events to reach a wider audience and we are also grateful to Fyvie Coop for donating refreshments for some of our events.

What a glorious term we have had with the weather. It has again been a busy term with lots more to accomplish before the summer holidays. Our pupils have again been developing their skills for learning life and work by leading their learning with an Open Afternoon during World Book Day and a Community Café to celebrate VE Day.

World Book Day



As always, we have aligned our learning to the 17 interlinked global goals designed to be a "blueprint to achieve a better and more sustainable future for all". Our Global Goal of the month was Global Goal 4 – Quality Education. We linked this to our World Book Day so our parents and carers could share what we had been learning about in our Play Journey which is one of our Priorities in our School Improvement Plan.

Our pupils again led the organisation of the afternoon, designed the play/discovery areas, World Book Day stations and their Business Brain Stalls for the afternoon showing their Leadership qualities such as Teamwork, Creativity and Problem Solving all linked to our Learning, Life and Work skills.



Pupils were asked their views as linked The United Nations of the

Convention on the Rights of the Child (UNCRC) Articles 12 & 13 about what they would like to improve their experience in play or as we call it 'Discovery Time'. From the pupil views we have invested in items that they have asked for such as a

marble run, more items for the water play area, sand, kinetic sand, magnets and magnet construction sets.

These will develop skills such as problem solving, critical thinking, co-operative play, memory, creativity, emotional regulation, wellbeing, language and communication.



Community Café & VE Celebrations

We had an absolutely amazing turn out for our very first Community Café. Our pupils wanted to continue their journey on using their business brains and set up a café for the community to enjoy. As part of this they felt it would be appropriate to also celebrate VE Day.





This was linked to Articles 29 & 31 in the UNCRC. Our learners again developed



Pupils successfully made home bakes, decorated plant pots and planted seeds to sell and showcased their singing and singing in Makaton. Our Pupils views (UNCRC Article 12) have again been taken for their latest Context



for Learning when studying 'Fae Heed te Tae'. Pupils wanted to learn about how does the brain work? How do we see different colours and others don't? Why do germs infect your body? Why are veins blue but carry red blood? How does the heart pump? How does the body work? The Context for Learning links to our Global Goal 3 Good Health and Well-being and also Article 24 of the UNCRC. We have also had the opportunity





to talk to several people in our community about the human body, differences and their experiences. Thank you to Susanna Bichard & her guide dog Jack, who discussed visual impairment and the importance of guide dogs, Laura O'Donnell for her expertise in the dental field and Rachel,

Rosie & Archie Innes who let the pupils spend time with a baby and discuss how their needs are similar and different to older children.

Rights Respecting Schools



As a school we are currently working on achieving our accreditation at Bronze and then Silver Level for Rights Respecting Schools. Part of this is to inform the whole school community that we are working on RRSA (Article – Everyone must know Children's rights).

The Rights Respecting Leadership Group as school is



made up of a mixture of pupils from P1-7. The pupils in this groups have made a PowerPoint presentation to discuss how the convention works (Articles 43-45) which they have shared at our Open afternoon, our Community Café and at Assembly.



Rag Bag Recycling Scheme.

A reminder that we have a Rag Bag Container in our school playground. The 'Rag Bag' recycling scheme has been developed to provide regular fundraising for schools in Scotland. The scheme increases awareness about textile recycling. Please think of us if you are having a clear out. We can accept clothing, paired shoes, handbags, belts etc. Just pop them into a bag and deposit in the container.



A huge thank you to the community for supporting this important fundraiser. We have been amazed at how quickly it fills up. On average we are receiving approximately £75 every three months!

Cybersecurity Handy Hints

Staying Safe Online: Protecting Yourself from Scams and Cyber Threats

We are sharing some practical steps to help keep your personal information and accounts safe. Please take a few moments to review these tips and share them with others.

1. Recognising Suspicious Emails

- Check the sender's email address fraudulent emails often come from addresses that look similar to legitimate ones but have small differences (e.g., '@bt-support.com' instead of '@bt.com').
- Beware of urgent requests scammers often pressure you to act quickly, such as buying gift cards or sending personal information.
- Look for poor spelling & grammar many phishing emails contain errors that genuine companies would not make.
- Do not click suspicious links or attachments These can install malware or steal your login details.
- Verify unusual requests if you receive an email from someone you know asking for money or personal details, call them directly to confirm.

2. Strengthening Your Security

- Use strong passwords a good password is at least 12 characters long and includes a mix of letters, numbers, and symbols. Avoid using obvious words (e.g., 'password123').
- Enable two-factor authentication (2FA) this adds an extra layer of security when logging into accounts by requiring a second step (e.g., a text message code).
- Keep your software updated ensure your computer, phone, and apps are regularly updated to fix security vulnerabilities.
- Use secure Wi-Fi avoid logging into sensitive accounts on public Wi-Fi without using a VPN (Virtual Private Network).
- Backup important data store important documents and files securely, either using an encrypted USB drive or a trusted cloud service.

3. What to Do If You Receive a Scam Email

- Do not reply or engage with the email.
- Do not click on links or open attachments.
- Report the scam email by forwarding it to report@phishing.gov.uk (UK Government's National Cyber Security Centre).
- Mark the email as spam in your inbox to prevent future messages.

4. Protecting Personal Data

 Be cautious when sharing personal information – only share details with trusted individuals and organisations.



• Dispose of old devices securely If you replace your phone or computer, ensure all data is wiped before selling, donating, or recycling it.

5. Where to Get Help

- If you think you may have been the victim of cyber fraud or cyber-crime, you should report it toolice Scotland (Call 101)
- Visit www.cyberaware.gov.uk for more safety tips.
- By staying alert and following these simple security measures, we can protect ourselves and our contacts from cyber threats.


We look forward to exploring exciting learning opportunities for all both in school and in the wider community.

Tariffs, trump, trade, terror !!!!!!! But for the Formartine Fairtrade group—it is business as usual –and here's why!



Crazy times we live in and it is so hard to understand what is going on.

Yet, all of us know what trade means. And most of us, since swapping football cards in the school playground know what trading fairly means and the outcomes when there is bullying and no fair deals.

As we can see in our world events, bullying isn't confined to the playground and those in power can bully and cheat –and it seems often do!

Much is said about free trade and tariffs. Fairtrade has a different emphasis. Fairtrade works to ensure that those who produce goods in poorer countries are not given a poor deal. In other words—no bullying at the expense of the weaker and a fair, level playing field for all.

Trade tariffs are taxes on imported goods, while Fair Trade focuses on ethical and equitable trading practices, such as fair prices and working conditions along with good social and environmental standards for producers.

Last month, Scotland renewed its status as a Fairtrade Nation, first achieved in 2013. At a recent debate in the Scottish Parliament, Angus Robertson, External Affairs Secretary, made the following points...

"Being a Fairtrade Nation is about more than just a title; it reflects our values as a country that champions ethical trade, supports producers in the Global South, and takes real action on poverty and inequality."

"As good global citizens, we remain dedicated to raising awareness, driving change, and ensuring

Fairtrade remains at the heart of Scotland's global outlook."

So, it is good to know that despite the current trade chaos and rising prices, as a nation we still value the principle of a fair wage for fair work.

In May 2025, The Hut Youth Project celebrated 27 years of creating a fun, safe supportive space for the youth of our community and the Meldrum Academy catchment area. We run two sessions; currently Monday 7-9 for S1-S6 pupils and

Thursdays 6:30-8:30 for Primary 7, with both sessions being run by volunteers.

Since beginning the Primary 7 sessions on a Thursday we have had a very good turn-out each week. We have also been doing some work with this current P7 group aimed at supporting them in their transition to S1 after summer.



This success led to us inviting the current Primary 6 moving into Primary 7 to come for a taster session 6:30-8:30pm on Thursday 29th May. The Tarves School summer fete is at the beginning of June and we will have our own tables outside The Hut, hoping to raise funds to continue to support our youth over months/year ahead.


We recently had our annual AGM and have now a full committee but are still actively looking for parents / volunteers to join our fundraising team. Please contact us if you are interested in getting involved.





The background work of the whole THP committee carries on almost invisibly regardless of season, weather and other commitments.

The real workers meet on a Monday and Thursday, setting up new displays, cataloguing and generally being hands on.

All essential work. Our centrepiece Victorian classroom has been well used in the last twelve months thanks to Catherine for communicating through web sites and hosting whole schools! Those who attend to the wild flowers on the glebe path, do research, quietly keep an eye on the fuel tank, sweep up leaves or maintain the building or equipment - you are not forgotten. That is essential work too.

We appreciate all the support given to our fund raisers and particularly thank all who helped us make such a fantastic total at our recent musical event.


Our other meetings for this session are as follows:
