Welcome to the first 2025 edition of the Tarves and Barthol Chapel Newsletter Tune in to BBC Sounds

As I am writing this, it's blowing a gale outside, it's cold and the thought of being outside is at the bottom of the 'to do' list.

Then the word 'but' comes in – how many readers use BBC Sounds for the huge variety of information there is, books to listen to, building a basic knowledge on subjects that you had never considered before? The joy of podcasts become a fixed source of sitting and relaxing to anything between 10



mins and an hour. This all links to the newspaper heading on the right – the natural world comes in the form of a podcast too. There are podcast examples of sounds of nature in a forest, in the jungle, sounds of the sea, and specific music matching the sounds of calming weather, and then verbal guides from those who are already connected to the natural world and sharing their thoughts on what you can participate in while you are outdoors. There is even one called the Sleeping Forecast with one episode a mix of restful music and readings from Shackleton's 1902 Antarctic expedition.

If you click onto a heading that sounds interesting, listen to the first episode, enjoy it but then decide – do I be indulgent and listen to all 15 episodes, which would take the whole afternoon or enjoy 2/3 episodes and know that once you have time to relax later, then the stories/musical pieces are a priority in unwinding from the day's events?

Further topic choices covered are vast – ranging from historical events that we were already knew a bit to events we are unaware of, there's politics for the brave, then some light laughter to take the sting out of these political issues, various aspects of catering and cooking, geographical topics – there is something for everyone. Listening to the voice of someone telling a story becomes personal if your surroundings are quiet and although this solitary voice is broadcasting to all listeners, it is also talking directly to you.

Although we want time to speed up from the long winter we've just experienced, allow yourselves short intervals of relaxation to unwind and reflect and be ready for the next commitment you have.

There's an ancient poem directed towards God that says: 'You have searched me Lord and you know me.' What the poet is saying that the God of the universe has looked deep inside him, has seen all his flaws and side effects, and still wants to know him, still wants to be associated with him.

At the heart of the Christian faith is a confidence that God knows everything about us and still chooses to love us. The challenge of the Christian faith is to then use confidence and bedrock to take that same level of love out to our communities and our world. The challenge is to love everyone with the same side-effect free love that God has loved us with.

It is two years since the passing of David G. Williamson who many of you will remember from his time as the owner & postmaster of the local general store 'Adam Duthie & Co'

Davie had a great love for Tarves having been the Captain of our BB Company; he also taught many of the then village youth to play the bugle, the bagpipes or possibly both.

In addition to personal bequests, Davie directed that funds be passed to eight local organisations, Tarves Parish Church, Tarves War Memorial Fund, The Melvin Hall, Tarves Heritage, Tarves Bowling Club, The Hut Youth Group, The Flower Show and Tarves Christmas Lights fund. As with many estates, it has taken some time to finalise the collection of all funds and for these to be distributed to the worthy causes he wished to support. In the main this has now been completed and the majority of the funds were distributed to the recipients at the end of last year.

Rag Bag Recycling Scheme



A reminder that we have a Rag Bag Container in our school playground. The 'Rag Bag' recycling scheme has been developed to provide regular fundraising for schools in Scotland. The scheme increases awareness about textile recycling. Please think of us if you are having a clear out. We can accept clothing, paired shoes, handbags, belts etc. *Just pop them into a bag and deposit in the container*. A huge thank you to the community for supporting this important fundraiser. We have been amazed at how quickly it fills up. On average we are receiving approximately £75 every three months!



Ellon and District Men's Shed

The last few months have been very busy for the Shed.

The new mechanical workshop has been busy refurbishing bikes and renovating a 1985 Royal Enfield Bullet 500cc motorbike. This was very generously donated to us and has been restored to a high standard

(photo) by Shed members and is now available for purchase (please contact us ellonmensshed@gmail.com) if you are interested. Sustrans have also held two bike maintenance training classes at the Shed and we expect more to take place later this year.

We have been very fortunate to receive two significant funding grants. Thanks to people voting for us, we received £18,903 for the installation of solar panels and a linked battery system. This should be installed (along with some related electrical modifications) in mid-March. This should save us between 25% and 50% of our electricity costs and contribute to a reduction in our carbon footprint. We are received £7500 from the Community Mental Health and Wellbeing Fund (round 4) to support our mechanical workshop and our running costs in 2025. We also were delighted to receive £500 from Greens in Ellon from their Christmas collection and a very generous donation of £2,000 from the crew of the Ocean Endeavour's Christmas raffle.

Two of the Shed members are progressing with their SQA qualifications to further support IT training. We are now offering 3D-printing training courses to Shed members.


Despite the weather, the Shed's Pétanque Club continued meeting on Thursday afternoons. Please see our Facebook page for announcements about future meeting times. If you are interested, please get in touch.

The woodworking workshop continues to be busy with Shedders making/refurbishing chairs, benches, water toys and mud kitchens for local schools, bird boxes and hedgehog feeding stations, wood turning and fantastic Vespa scooters for toddlers. The CNC router has been used to make plaques, house signs, memorials for pets (photo) and miniature specialist tables for bonsai trees (photo). All these items are available to order and designs can me modified as needed.

In mid-January we held meetings to discuss the possibility of starting a 'Women's Shed'. The meetings were very well attended, and a small working group is now progressing the idea. The Men's Shed will carry on being run as a social/hobby place for men. The underpinning need for a dedicated *men's* shed hasn't changed. But we have a very well-equipped facility that is only open 3 days out of 7. We are frequently asked if women can use the Shed. Combining these two facts has led us to consider a women's shed running in parallel with the men's shed.

We are open for new members to join the Men's Shed (membership is free). Many are of the opinion that men need to be 'good at DIY', using (continued on Page 15)

Friends of Anchor in ARI recently appealed for sewn drainage bags and angel hearts for their patients; the bag is rectangular circa A4 size with about a metre of ribbon attached to the bag, and patients carry a plastic drainage bag inside this bespoke fabric shoulder bag. Another appeal was for 'angel



hearts' for post-surgery ladies; these are exactly as they sound – fabric hearts with a small tag at the top of each heart for a future

ribbon to be tied on at a comfortable length. They provide a comfort for these patients, used underarm as a soft surface or the top 'V' cradling at the back of the neck. They are filled with hollowfibre as this can be washed should the heart be marked or needing a 'refresh.'
