As soon as we go into any supermarket, large or small, we are bombarded with 6' high stands of chocolate, miles of wrapping paper and ribbon, cards by the dozen and just how many of them will we send, in the postal sense @ \pounds 1.65 for a first class or 85p for second class. Personally handed to the recipient is great, almost a way of saying we value our 'close by' friends and relatives where distance is not an issue.

Then we move on to TV adverts, with banqueting tables, groaning with a huge turkey and all accompaniments associated by a 'modern' Christmas, with the prices beginning with the word 'only.' 40 - 50 years ago, if you had chicken at Christmas that was something very special and you almost forgot the taste of it for the next 11 months until next time around.

We are not celebrating Christmas as we should, the excesses out there are not equal because they just do not apply to everyone. This is where my editor letter heading kicks in.

2 alternatives are presented here – the first one is 'buy 10% less' and make a positive plan to donate these unspent funds to one of the local charities around Aberdeen and the Shire. There are so many children and adults who will never have what we take for granted, and 10% of a spend, multiplied by several people following this suggestion could make such a difference to others whom we will never know in person, but will know that in kind, they can smile and have a day of happiness.

Second alternative is to buy 10% more, many organisations have websites which have 'much needed' items for their service users. Would many of us notice an extra 10% spend, probably not, and if each shopper bought toiletries/basic household food/baby & children's clothing/toys and any other items each charity suggests, then you are contributing towards a smile or a sigh of relief for any parent/family or person who is presented with a selection of shopping/clothes/gifts that can make such a difference at this time of year. Of course, you can just ignore the suggestion of spending 10% less or buying 10% more and turn it into spending 20% less or buying 20% more.


Aqua park and went swimming at Olympia.

Unfortunately we were not successful in our application to the Architectural Heritage Fund and so are looking into alternative sources of funds. This will enable us to complete the necessary surveys etc needed for the business plan.

We were successful with our application to the lottery Community Fund and this has enabled us to expand the events we are holding at the hub in the cooler months when the heating is costly.

Beyond Food: A Hub for Shared Resources

The Shelf isn't just about food, it welcomes donations of other items such as toys, books, games, a few clothes and non-electrical household items.

In line with its mission, the Udny Community Shelf operates in a straightforward and transparent way. Volunteers are essential to this model, as they take on tasks like checking dates, rotating stock, and managing the space. We are looking to expand our volunteer team further. We are needing extra help in closing the Shelf at 1.30pm each day, or collecting from Pitmedden and Newmachar at 8.45 pm, and Oldmeldrum on a Saturday evening. Collecting the food and taking it to the Shelf and unpacking into the trailer. We currently have 4 volunteers collecting 7 days a week, and need a couple of people to help out on just one evening a week. By keeping the operation minimal and volunteer-driven, the Shelf can run sustainably, we rely on the dedication of local people who are invested in their community's well-being.

To spread the word and keep the community informed, the Udny Community Shelf team uses social media to promote new donations and upcoming needs. This way, everyone can stay up to date on what's available or what might be needed, creating a real-time community resource that's both practical and connected.

With each donation and each visit, Udny Community Shelf proves that small actions, when combined, can have a significant impact. 

We were invited to Methlick Guild in November when the speakers were from one of the new projects we are supporting, "Build my Church." This was inspired by a Scottish Charity "Bear Necessities" which started its work providing items for Bulgarian children and has grown into an organisation providing medical care, a soup kitchen, women's support as well as spiritual care. "Build my Church" is an initiative to establish a Christian Church in a residential area of Orizari in Bulgaria providing spiritual, emotional, physical and intellectual needs for the community. Hopefully they will be able to achieve their goal with support & funds from the Guild.


